Dear Friends,







It is my pleasure to write a letter recognizing the benefits the AIM program has given our students at the Kleptz Early Learning Center. We became acquainted with the program through a professional development session Dr. Jo Geiger provided for our teachers several years ago. After the session, teachers requested AIM be a part of our regular classroom lessons at the Kleptz Early Learning Center.

When teachers were asked why they have included AIM as part of their classroom experiences, they quickly responded with the many reasons. One teacher stated our students need fine and gross motor opportunities. They also need help working on body awareness. These skills are important for their development. The extra exercises help the students build these skills.

Another teacher responded that AIM helps students work on their coordination and following directions. It is a fun and active way to incorporate movement throughout the day.
