
Dear AIM Friends and Supporters,

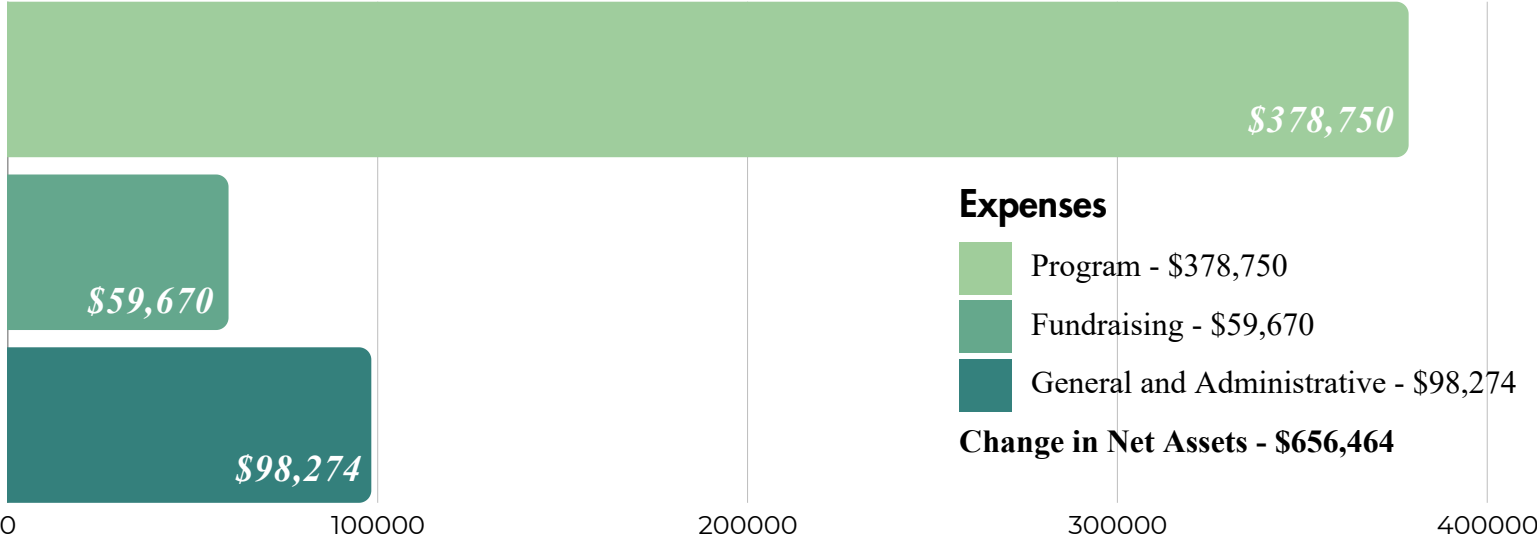

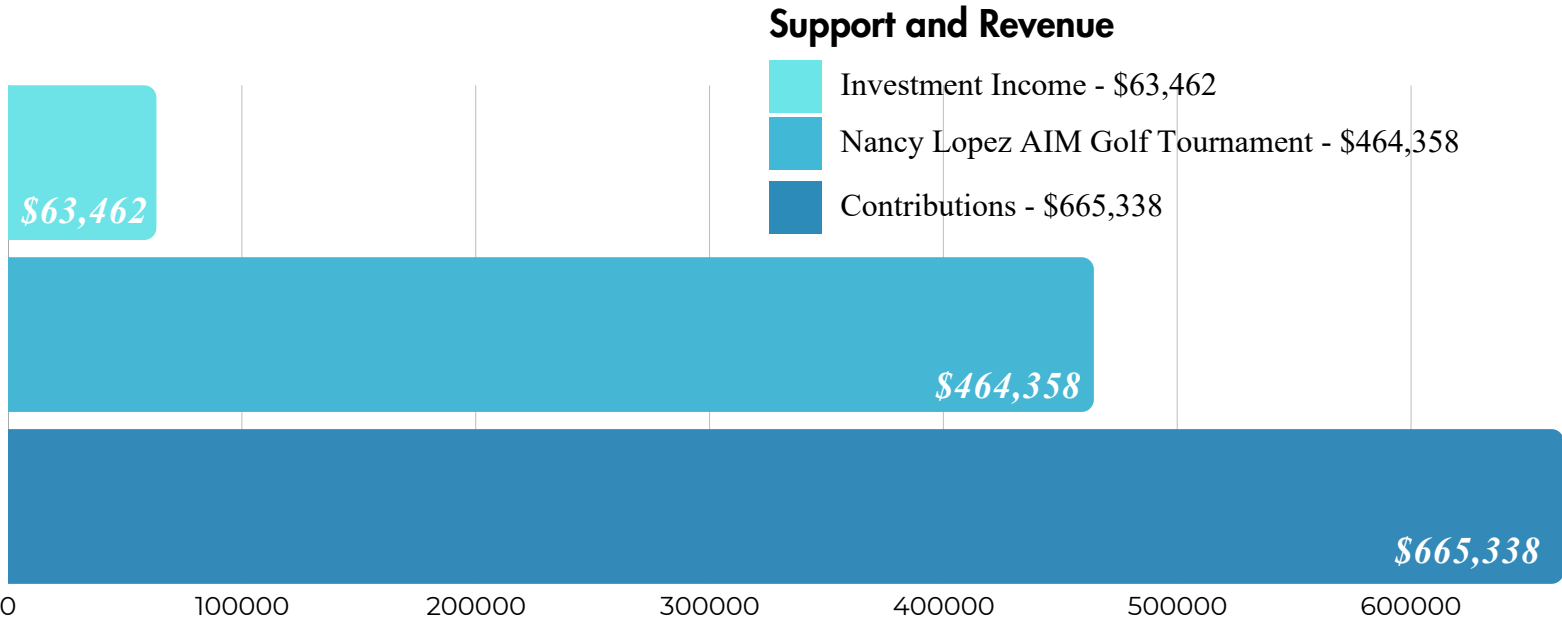
